

Bucks County Public Libraries: Download eBooks to a Kindle



You can borrow Kindle books from the Bucks County Public Libraries to read on any generation Kindle device, free Kindle app, or in your browser with Kindle Cloud Reader. Public library books for Kindle provide the same unique features as Kindle and Kindle books, including technology that synchronizes your notes, highlights and last page read, real page numbers, and more.

Finding Bucks County Library Books for Kindle

From any computer, visit <http://buckslib.lib.overdrive.com>, search for a book, and select a Kindle edition.

Check Out a Public Library Book for a Kindle with Wi-Fi

1. Visit <http://buckslib.lib.overdrive.com>
2. Search for the book you want and add the Kindle edition to your cart.
3. Click on **Proceed to Checkout** (you will be required to enter your library card and Pin if you haven't already).
4. Choose your lending period (7 or 14 days) and click on **Confirm Check Out**.
5. Click on **Get for Kindle**. You will then be directed to Amazon.com to check out your public library loan. You may be required to login to your Amazon.com account -- or create a new account -- if you're not already logged in.
6. Choose to read the book on your Kindle device, free reading app, or Kindle Cloud Reader. Select the Kindle app or device you would like to deliver the book to from the **Deliver To** box.
7. Click the **Get Library Book** button.

Note: Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection. If trying to send to a Kindle device which does not have an active Wi-Fi connection, you may instead choose to load your library book via USB. Both Mac and Windows users can manage Kindle content through a USB connection. See the next section.

Check Out a Public Library Book for a Kindle without Wi-Fi

1. Visit <http://buckslib.lib.overdrive.com>
2. Search for the book you want and add the Kindle edition to your cart.
3. Click on **Proceed to Checkout** (you will be required to enter your library card and Pin if you haven't already).
4. Choose your lending period (7 or 14 days) and click on **Confirm Check Out**.
5. Click on **Get for Kindle**. You will then be directed to Amazon.com to check out your public library loan. You may be required to login to your Amazon.com account -- or create a new account -- if you're not already logged in.
6. Select "Transfer via Computer" from the **Deliver To** drop-down box. Then click the **Get Library Book** button.
7. A window will open asking you to Open or Save the file. Save it to a place on your computer where you can access it easily.
8. Connect your Kindle to the computer with the USB cable, and transfer the file you just saved to your Kindle.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will I be notified before my library book loan expires?

Yes. Three days before the end of the loan period, Amazon will send a courtesy reminder e-mail about the loan expiration. Once the loan period has ended, an additional e-mail notification will be sent.

How do I view the status of my loan?

You can view the status of a public library book for Kindle from the [Manage Your Kindle](#) page on the Amazon website. Click on the "+" symbol next to any title to view more details about any book that you've borrowed including the expiration date.

You can also access all of the materials that you currently have checked out on your library's OverDrive-powered website (<http://buckslib.lib.overdrive.com>). Within this site, click My Downloads, then My Bookshelf.

What happens to my notes and highlights after a loan expires?

You can always access your notes and highlights through kindle.amazon.com, even after a book expires. And if you check a book out again, or purchase it from Amazon.com, all of your notes and highlights will appear in the book as before the loan expired.

What Kindle devices can I read public library books on?

You can read borrowed Kindle books on any generation Kindle device or all free Kindle apps, as well as in your web browser with Kindle Cloud Reader.

Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection. If you are trying to send a library book to a Kindle device and you do not have an active Wi-Fi connection, you can load your library book via USB instead.

How do I send library books to my Kindle device or reading app?

Once a public library book has been checked out, you can send it to any registered Kindle device or reading app from the Amazon [Manage Your Kindle](#) page. Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device.

Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection. If trying to send to a Kindle device and do not have an active Wi-Fi connection, you may instead choose to load your library book via USB.

Can I return a book before the due date?

Go to www.amazon.com and click on [Manage Your Kindle](#) (you may have to log onto your Amazon account). Library books have 'public library' after the title of the book. Hover on the Actions button to return the book early. If you return the book early, a 'marker' remains on your Kindle that you will want to delete. (The marker is deleted automatically when the book expires on the due date.) Other options are also available from this page.
